



Terms and Conditions—Residential Indoor Lighting Program

Program Offer: The Program covers products purchased and/or services rendered **on or after January 1, 2010.**

Program Requirements:

1. Compact Fluorescent and LED lamp and fixtures must be ENERGY STAR qualified residential lighting products and listed on the ENERGY STAR list provided on their website.
2. ENERGY STAR Qualified Fixtures apply to many different fixture types, including CFL can fixtures, surface mount, linear fluorescents (typically small single lamp products) and torchiere lamps. All of these types qualify as long as they meet the minimum 9 Watt requirement of this incentive program.
3. Fluorescent tube lamp fixtures must be type T8 (or T5) with electronic ballasts.
4. A fluorescent fixture retrofit must include the purchase of one or more ballasts and the number of fluorescent lamps indicated by the type of fixtures indicated on the incentive request form.
5. Proof of purchase (copy of receipt or invoice) must be provided to the Cooperative. For retrofit applications, proof of purchase must be provided for the necessary number of ballasts and lamps as indicated by the fixture type on the rebate form.
6. Residential rebates are available for a limited number of each type of lighting product (see limits provided in the rebate table on the current incentive form).
7. Most rebates are available for lighting products that are above a certain minimum wattage size (see minimum sizes in the rebate table on the current incentive form).
8. Ag lighting equipment must be rated for the intended application (See below).
9. REBATE SHOULD NOT EXCEED PURCHASE PRICE.

ENERGY STAR Verification:

ENERGY STAR listings can be found at: <http://www.energystar.gov>. ENERGY STAR qualification for residential members can be verified by one of the following:

1. Member provides cutout of package showing ENERGY STAR logo, product type and model.
2. Member provides cutout of UPC code and model from product package.
3. Member provides printout showing that the equipment on their invoice is listed on the ENERGY STAR website.

Agricultural Requirements

1. Special cold-start ballasts are needed for fluorescent lights used in buildings such as machine sheds, free-stall dairy barns and swine growing/finishing buildings.
2. Heat Lamp Sockets - Use porcelain sockets for all lamps designed to produce heat. Fixtures made of rubber and plastic are not acceptable.
3. For livestock buildings:
 - use dust and moisture tight nonmetallic fixtures with shatterproof, vapor tight globes.
 - Select fluorescent light fixtures made of corrosion-resistant materials with gasketed covers.
 - Fixtures with fiberglass or aluminum enclosures and Lexan® covers are recommended. Do not use fixtures made of ABS plastic and with acrylic diffusers in buildings where chemicals and high pressure hot water cleaning and sanitizing systems are used.

Warranty Information:

The cooperative makes no warranties, expressed or implied, with respect to equipment operation, material, workmanship or manufacturing. The Cooperative does not guarantee that a certain level of energy or cost savings will result from the use of products covered by this program.

Limitation of Liability:

Participating Members agree that the Cooperative's liability, in connection with this Program, is limited to paying the Program Incentive specified (when all Terms and Conditions have been satisfied by the member). Under no circumstances shall the Cooperative be liable for any consequential or incidental damages resulting from participation in this Program. The Cooperative will not be responsible for any tax liability that may be imposed on the Participating Member as a result of the payment of Program Incentives.

Participating Member's Certification:

Participating Member certifies that he/she purchased and installed the equipment listed in their application at their defined location served by the Cooperative. Participating Member agrees that all information is true and that he/she has conformed to all of the program and equipment requirements listed in the application.

Program Changes/Termination:

While this rebate program will be in effect for an indefinite period, the Cooperative reserves the right to extend, modify (this includes incentive levels) or terminate this Program without prior or further notice. The member is responsible for checking with the Cooperative to determine whether the program has been changed or is still in effect.

Other Conditions

The Cooperative reserves the right to inspect installations before issuing the rebate. If the application does not comply with the Cooperative's rules and qualifications, the rebate amount may be adjusted.

Members must apply for rebates within 6 months of the purchase date (as shown on the member's invoice). Past eligibility, however, does not guarantee that equipment will meet criteria for current programs in effect.
